Job Description

Main purpose of the job:

You will have responsibility for delivering the teaching and assessment of Clinical Skills, including physical examination, procedural skills and communication skills. You will work with the multi-disciplinary team, the Senior Clinical Skills Tutor and other Clinical Skills Tutors to ensure the efficient and effective delivery of teaching programmes in accordance with the College's education strategy and GMC requirements as well as implementing the External Affairs strategy, for medical students attending the University of Exeter Medical School.

Main duties and accountabilities:

- 1. Use appropriate teaching, learning support and assessment methods.
- 2. Identify areas where current provision is in need of revision or improvement and contribute to the planning, design and development of objectives and material.
- 3. Select appropriate assessment instruments and criteria, assess the work and progress of students by reference to the criteria and provide constructive feedback to students.
- 4. Set, mark and assess work and examinations and provide feedback to students.
- 5. Ensure that teaching design and delivery complies with the quality standards and regulations of the University, GMC Standards and College.

Liaison and Networking

Participate in and develop external networks, for example to contribute to student recruitment, building relationships for future activities and to build a close working relationship with the clinical areas where students will undertake placements, e.g. GP surgery, Acute medical unit.

Managing people

- 1. Mentor colleagues with less experience and advise on personal development
- 2. Co-ordinate the work of others to ensure sessions are delivered to the standards required.

Initiative, problem-solving and decision-making

- 1. Identify the need for developing the content or structure of teaching sessions with colleagues and make proposals on how this should be achieved.
- 2. Contribute to the accreditation of programmes and quality control processes.
- 3. Tackle issues affecting the quality of delivery within scope of own level of responsibility, referring more serious matters to others, as appropriate.

Planning and managing resources

1. Co-ordinate with others (such as support staff or academic colleagues) to ensure student needs and expectations are met.

2. Fulfil administrative duties such as timetabling, examinations, assessment of progress and student attendance.
